- Other: 4%

- Heating: Heat only the parts of the house you are using by utilizing a form of radiant heat

- Water heating: Wrap your water heater with an insulation blanket
- Lighting: Change to CFL bulbs. CFL bulbs draw 75% less energy than incandescent
- Computers & electronics: Switch out your old PC for a laptop
- Appliances: Unplug devices when not in use
- Refrigerator: Update your refrigerator.
- Other: Common sense!!
